

# AUTHOR GUIDELINES

## The 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Law, Economic and Governance

The article must be relevant to the theme of the conference:

1. Environmental Law, Economic, and Governance;
2. Environmental Justice and Progressive Law;
3. Climate Action in Global Uncertainty.

Authorship and APC:

1. No more than 2 (two) papers per author (including as a co-author)/
2. APC is chargeable for submitted articles declined by IOP for not following EES scope or IOPP policies and guidelines.

Please ensure that all authors have prepared their papers using **Microsoft Word or LaTeX**, according to the guidelines and templates provided. The following points are set by the IOP-ConfSer-template file and must be followed to avoid problems in the production of your proceedings article:

### General Requirements:

#### a. Page Layout

- Page size: European A4;
- Top-margin: 4 cm; bottom-margin: 2.7 cm; left- and right-margin: 2.5 cm;
- No page numbers, no other page headers or footers;
- Text is single-spaced, not double-spaced;
- All pages are portrait orientation.

#### b. Paper Content

- The paper includes the author name(s) and affiliation(s) (Department, Institution, City, Country), use institutional email address (if any).
- The Abstract consists between 150-250 words providing concise information about the content of the article, including the main results obtained and conclusions drawn.
- The Keyword consists of maximum 5 words.
- All articles must have a title, authors and affiliations, and an abstract.
- The abstract must not contain any table numbers, figure numbers, references or displayed mathematics. Leave 10 mm space below the abstract before starting the main text of your article on the same page.
- Organize the main text using section headings, and include any equations, figures, tables, lists etc.
- The manuscript written uses Cambria (11 pt) with a length of 4,000-5,000 words.
- The acceptable similarity percentage for the article is below 25% (no exclusions).
- Figures and tables: Figures and tables must be placed close to where they are mentioned in the text, not all together at the end of the article. All figures and tables must have a caption. The template file includes placeholder text boxes for a figure and a table. Replace the

placeholder information following the instructions in the template. Copy and paste the text boxes to add more tables or figures. Delete the text boxes if they are not required.

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- The author could add an Acknowledgment section; wishing to acknowledge assistance or encouragement from colleagues, unique work by technical staff, or financial support from organizations should do so in an unnumbered acknowledgments section immediately following the last numbered section of the paper.

### c. References

- Use **Vancouver** (numbered) or Harvard (author-year) system for citing your references. Items in the reference list can be formatted in any style, as long as each item contains all the information needed to find the reference.
- References must contain minimum 15 primary literatures such as journal and books. At least 60% of literatures are journals and 40% of books, proceedings, and related sources.
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- Conference proceedings (published in a conference series)

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Authors, Year, Dataset title, Repository name, URL (DOI if available)
